

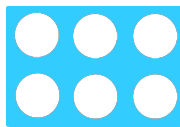
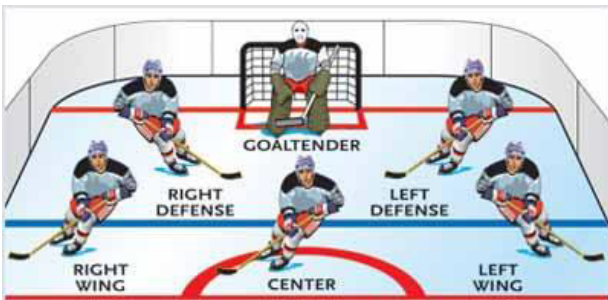
Doubling the Teams

Tell a grown up what a double is.

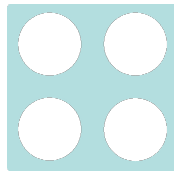
Write you double as a sum $3 + 3 = 6$

At the ice hockey rink Double 6



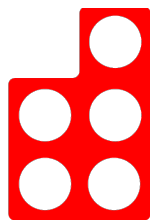
