Thursday 14th January Year R - Home Learning

Maths- ways to make 5 (number bonds to 5)

The number 5, like all numbers, is made up of other smaller value numbers eg 1,1 and 3 or 4 and 1.

Using 5 counters or coins can children arrange the 5 in different ways



or



and so on.

Using 5 items, make a target or bucket and throw the 5 at the target. Noticing how many fell into the target and how many land outside. Encourage children to record their results, as numbers or a simple sum 2+3 5+0 4+1

Play Bunny Ears. Using 2 hands to be the ears, how many ways can you show 5 fingers on 2 hands? Questions to ask include "Can you see what number I have made? Can you make ears same as mine? How many different ways can we find?"

Social and emotional activity- SCARF time (we complete this in class with Harold the giraffe in a scarf). This week we are thinking about being safe online. Start with a conversation about all the different ways that computers help us (e.g. we can do our shopping, find out the weather forecast, play games, read stories, watch TV, see others etc.)

Then discuss how we have to be careful when using computers. Discuss with your child how they should never share information about ourselves with people they don't know and if they ever see or hear anything scary when playing on a device they should tell you - or another grown-up at home, straight away.
